

Man who fell down shaft dies

YERMO — Kenneth "Rusty" Lasley, 41, of Vista, died of injuries sustained in

deep, he said. The man's son did not venture into the mine, Hubbard said.

The young boy rode his ATV to one of the few homes nearby, two or three miles from the mine shaft to seek help, and the homeowners called deputies.
