## Study Area for the R-2508 JLUS

- Edwards Air Force Base
- Fort Irwin
- Naval Air Weapons Station China Lake
- The R-2508 Special Use Airspace Complex



Two committees are providing information and policy guidance to the Project Team:

- The Advisory Committee: policy-level representatives from organizations with land use control in study area.
- Technical Committee: technical experts, representatives from stakeholder groups



What's been done so far:

- Workshop #1 (October 16-17, 2006): Project Introduction and Issue Identification.
- Public Forum #1 (October 16): Project Introduction.
- Workshop #2 (February 2007): Initial development of potential strategies



## Upcoming events:

- Technical Committee Workshop #3 (May 15-17, 2007): Develop recommended strategies for Advisory Committee review.
- Advisory Committee Workshop #3 (June 22, 2007): Review recommended strategies.

A draft JLUS document will be developed over the summer. After a final AC/TC workshop, a period of public review, and a public forum, a final JLUS should be published by October 2007.
